Toni Andreu and Edwin van de Ketterij participated at BioRegion of Catalonia Life Sciences and Healthcare Outlook Roundtable: Current realities and reasonable

The BioRegion report is the reference document on the Life Sciences and Healthcare industry in Catalonia, addressed to SMEs, entrepreneurs, researchers, policy makers, media and consultants. The 2019 edition of the Report was presented during a hybrid public event that combined the face-to-face and online format. The event include among other parts, an EATRIS-Plus Science Forum roundtable titled "Personalized Medicine: Building up a Cooperative Approach". Multiomics Capacity Mapping Survey completed and results published on the website

As part of WP1 we performed a mapping effort for omics technologies present within the Biomarkers platform members and benchmarking their technical features as well as the range of associated services provided. Altogether 24 institutes completed the mapping exercise and the data was integrated to EATRIS website with a filtering system for the "Institutes" page. This will increase the visibility of individual institutes and will therefore potentially increase the number of future collaboration opportunities. Moreover, the survey results also support the identification of sites for the performance assessment of omics technologies (ring testing) in WP3. Try out the search function here.

Exploration of collaboration opportunities with the iCAN initiative

EATRIS has been exploring collaboration opportunities with the <u>iCAN initiative</u>. iCAN is a Finnish led digital precision cancer medicine initiative that aims to integrate molecular data with digital health data in new and meaningful ways for discoveries and improved treatments. There are significant synergies with EATRIS-Plus project. Some of the preliminarily identified collaboration points include the use of common metadata schemes for -omics datasets, use of common metadata schemes for analysis workflows, the creation of collaborative and secure working analysis environment as a way to give access to data; as well as a discussion on quality metrics.

The NORLUX Neuro-Oncology Laboratory at the LIH Department of Oncology (DONC), in collaboration with the Centre Hospitalier de Luxembourg (CHL), the Laboratoire National de Santé (LNS), the Luxembourg Centre for Systems Biomedicine (LCSB) of the University

Evidence for 28 genetic disorders discovered by combining healthcare and research data

A collaboration between X-omics partner Radboudumc, GeneDx and

Exome-sequence datasets from the three different institutes were combined into a cohort of 31,058 patients in order to have more statistical power. It became the largest statistical study of these mutations to date. Read more.

EPF co-organised and EU-PEARL Stakeholder workshop "Patient engagement for IRPs in trial design"

The initiative 'EU Patient centric clinical trial platforms (EU-PEARL) aims to enable a transformation of drug development through multi-sponsor, multi-compound Integrated Research Platforms (IRPs). An IRP is a novel clinical development concept centered around a master protocol trial that can accommodate multi-sourced interventions, using an existing infrastructure of hospitals and federated patient data, and an agreed, optimized regulatory pathway.

The patient engagement session was a part of a series of workshops to engage project stakeholders/audiences on the project topics and foster discussion with a wider group. Read more.
